Beginning October 4th, CLJII will be teaching a course for the Glendale Community College Community Services Education Department.

The class, "**Ephemeral Cinema**," is a brief history of B-pictures, short subjects, animated cartoons, and - here's a shocker - cliffhanger serials, the stuff usually left out of college film history classes.

Class will be held at Hoover High School in Glendale from 7 p.m. to 9:30 for four Wednesdays. Class fee is \$65, including materials. All you need to bring is something to write with and on.

Covering the material in *genre* groups, the lectures will include Drama, Reality, and Mystery; Comedy, Musicals, Short Subjects, and Animated Cartoons; Westerns and Cliffhangers; Adventure, Horror, Fantasy, and SF.

Each week's class will also screen animated cartoons, short subjects, and trailers for feature films discussed that week.

In addition, that month's FW-EMs (October 23rd) will feature a B-movie sampler of six films representing the major genres.

Chairman Karl Lembke called the meeting to order at 11:14:49 a.m. The minutes were presented. They were accepted as corrected with the scribe abstaining.

New Members: Robin Reed, Margaret Newvine, Matt Reshonksky, Autumn VanDusen, and Adam Rakunas. All accepted.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer is absent for job-related reasons, so no report.

Facilities: No activity on construction or furniture. Dr. Gleason has ordered the bike rack and it should be delivered soon.

Computers: There has been a new addition to the room, a game server.

Hall Decorations: Some of the LaLaCon decorations are still up, and will be replaced as time permits.

Printing/Duplication: Part of the trouble with the Canon was using a non-standard cartridge. The Gestetner is still working on three belts out of four, so there's no reason to call out a repairman just for that.

The next time we have one out, we'll get the belt replaced while he's here. After some argument about landscape printing, it was agreed to bring somebody out to look at it.

Sound System: We have one, and it works. There was some trouble at the latest party, but it turned out to be tapes pressing against the machine.

Marketing: No representative, no report.

Outreach: Nothing new.

Library: One of the temporary librarians is on his way over, but hasn't arrived yet.

Reading Lists: Updates on the Children's List should be ready in about a month. Mr. Barrett is taking over the Adult List, but hasn't had time to do anything.

lasfs.org: Not here, yet. Karl hasn't seen any changes yet and hasn't made any himself to give the current webmaster room to work.

Westercon: The "three zone motion" passed, changing the rotation from north/south to north/central/south. No city may bid for a Westercon to be voted on in their zone unless there are no bids offered by the beginning of that year. If that happens, it becomes a no-zone year, and anybody can bid.

LOSCON 32: On track. A few issues have come up and been dealt with. We don't know for sure about the guest from Thailand. There have been two meetings, and the first Progress Report was sent out.

LOSCON 33: The chairman isn't here yet, but we're assured that all's going well and guests are being invited.

LaLaCon: Nothing new on this year's. Thanks and a round of applause were given George Van Wagner.

Library: As a librarian has arrived, we asked for a report. Not much has been going on, as neither John nor Greg finds it easy to get here. Greg has round a possible database program, Bookbag, that's only \$24.95, and will even work on a PDA. He explained that part of the trouble with missing books comes from different practices by various librarians, with Leigh Strother Vien doing things quite differently than Michael Mason did. Some of the "missing" books are set aside to be repaired or replaced, but the records on these aren't up to date. With time, this problem should gradually subside.

Securities Management: Removed from the acvie agenda until we have securities to manage.

Convention Delegates: Tadao at DemiCon; Karl, Brett,

Ed, and Liz at ComicCon.

Old Business: Brett Achorn had a report on Trademark registration. If we want to trademark LASFS as a collective membership, we need a plan to protect it. After much discussion, it was decided to create a minimalist plan which will satisfy the government and put it in the By-laws. We thanked him for his offer and for showing up, but didn't discuss the offer in detail. Our current webmaster reported by phone that he's updated lasfs.info, and is ready to move everything over.
