### Meeting 3896, April 12, 2012 President Marcia Minsky, President Karl Lembke, Scribe

President Marcia Minsky called meeting #3896 of the LASFS to order at 20:05. Or 4:00 PM by the clock on the wall. Tonight, on account of tonight's program, we're on Agenda Light again.

**Special Orders of Business:** Charlie Jackson, II announced some special orders, this week we lost a member of the Society. Word has come that Barry Workman died Tuesday afternoon. It was not unexpected, but it was also not welcome. Scratch has known BG Workman for many years, and he was always kind, courteous, opinionated, strong willed, and a friend to many. "Typical fan" – Hare Hobbs.

Jerry Pournelle met "Sarge" at LASFS while we were still at the park, and after that, Jerry got appointed Chancellor to a college campus in Baja. Sarge and he and an unremembered girl took a jeep down a thousand miles of bad road. If he had it to do again, he'd pick Sarge to go along. He was a good man and knew his limits. Mike Donahue never met anyone who devoted himself so unselfishly to doing good works for others. In his honor we had a long moment of silence.

Marcia explained her crown. This is National Library Week. She works in the Library, so her boss decided to honor two people – Marcia and another person. They would not let her take it off for the rest of the day. Includ-

ing in labs. And yes, it is the Cinderella Crown.

The **Menace** were read, and MaryAnn Canfield paid \$6.50 to name them "Pundamental". She also paid a 25¢ pun fine.

**Patron Saint Elliott Weinstein** was honored. Matthew Tepper: good fan and true. Friend for many years. He's one of those who invaded LASFS in the early 70s, about the same time as the Granada Hills contingent (he was from North Hollywood). He's one of those who came up with bizarre ideas. Redondo flea market will sell fleas on April 28th.

Elayne announced the library has 99% of the Hugo nominations. Milt: for those who haven't seen The List, Chris Garcia made it into an unusual category. He made Best Dramatic Short Form for his acceptance speech for last year's Hugo.

**Announcements:** Nick Smith: Nucleus Art Gallery in Alhambra, exhibit of art based on Silmarillion. Neat stuff.

Also, the musical Re-animator, based on the Lovecraft story, Herbert West, Reanimator. It's showing at The Hayworth, May 3 – July 8.

John DeChancie had some show and tell. He held up a magazine called Mondo Cult. He's connected with the magazine because he has three articles in it. It has a picture of Rondo Hatton on the cover. it will be in the library for look-over.

David Okamura had a short science report. LHC is accelerating to 4 TEV. Now they're starting to collide the beams, for a total of 8 TEV. And ... North Korean rocket launched. It only lasted a minute or so. The fallout will unfold for a few weeks. North Korea will probably ignore whatever the UN decides.

Jerry Pournelle rose to speak about a couple of items. First – pretty sure no FTL neutrinos exist. That turns out to have probably been faulty equipment. A few years ago, there was a flap over thimerosol, a preservative for vaccines, causing autism. The evidence was kind of lacking. In 2002, there were 6 cases per 1000. Thimerosol is now gone, and vaccines are a bit more expensive. For the last few years, Rate of autism is now 11.4/1000, an increase of 78%. All that means is we don't know what's going on. We don't even know if that's a true number. We may simply be diagnosing more. But people have been avoiding vaccines, with a corresponding rise in whooping cough and other diseases.

Debra Levin notes they've been modifying how autism is diagnosed, so that would affect numbers. Hare says back when he started being a guinea pig, he had a brain scan. OF their test subjects, only 1 in 12 had neural patterns they considered autistic. David Okamura: the one article he did not mention was recently published – the age of the father may be a link to risk, or maternal obesity or diabetes.

Jerry Pournelle: prior to 1940 doctors couldn't do much for you. What they could do is Do No Harm. What they did do was develop a system of taking careful case histories, and over time look at patterns. They could come up with This Seems To Be A Pattern. In the mental sciences, during that same period, everything was filtered through theories. All of them worthless. No basis in physiologies, and most of the case histories were made up. We're looking at autism through lenses of various theories, and no

one is doing careful case histories. If you're going to study something, study it rather than picking facts to fit your theory.

The scribe notes he's heard disparaging comments about checklist diagnoses and the subjectivity involved in deciding whether or not to check a box.

John Hertz: Mr. Niven is one of our more poetic writers – the art of poetry expressed in words. He's a pointillist – he puts little tiny dots of color, which resolve into a picture. He's a comedian. He's one of my favorite guests.

Arlene Satin: Although he's a wonderful writer, he seems to be a very quiet man, and you have to draw him out in a conversation. But once he's in a conversation, it's a great one. Jerry Pournelle: Niven proved you can make a living at this racket, provided you start with a big enough trust fund. Larry's a great sign of encouragement to Jerry. For the past few years, he's lost his memory to a great deal of radiation. He's found he couldn't remember people's names, but in practice, he's down to where Larry Niven

has been for the past 40 years. John Hertz: two points: 1) Mr. Niven and Dr. Pournelle put their money where their mouths were – a space conference some while ago. It seemed to have very productive results.

Niven has a sense of the right word. As Twain said, the right word is the difference between lightning and a lightning bug. Example: “Legendary”. That means it doesn't exist. The phoenix is legendary. My patience is legendary. – Larry Niven. Jerry Pournelle: If you're in a room with Niven, it doesn't matter who's in it. Niven wrote the most memorable scene anyone in the room has written. **Patron Saint Larry Niven** was given three cheers and a tree full of integers.


