BBC world news reports that in Italy, they have a detector, filled with lots of argon, hoping to detect some particles of dark matter. Karl remarked, Der Spiegel said they were using Xenon in their detectors. (Further research shows they're hoping dark matter will turn out to interact through the weak force, so they're looking for beta decay phenomena.) Ben Levin wondered if the new UU elements they've been discovering might hold the key to finding dark matter. Matthew Tepper pointed out the microscopic half-lives of these.

Registrar Michelle reported we did have a guest. Lawrence Azcarate, heard about us from his father who did a documentary back when we were meeting at Clifton's Cafeteria.

We honored the evening's **Patron Saint, Craig Miller**: Matthew recalled that Craig joined the club at about the same time he did. Fan of comics, SF, humor, and had a flair for PR. Craig Miller has grown up, and grown up good. He's been publicity for Lucasfilms.

Karl: someday we'll be able to Xerox a person. A copy either will or will not be a perfect copy, mentally. Either way, it will be an astonishing result. Ben commented on the implications of 3-d printers. Matthew said, you will probably see things I won't be able to imagine even reading SF.

Scott Beckstead has stepped up to chair LOSCON 41, but since this was very late, we haven't had time to think about themes.

LOSCON 41: chaired by Scott Beckstead, Hotel Liaison: Christian, Kim Marks-Brown, and Jason Justice. Treasurer is Elayne Pelz The bid was carried forward and the Beckstead, McGuire, Brown, and Justice committee will run LOSCON 41.

Patron Saint Maureen Garrett: Marty: She used to attend long ago, and drew the cover for *Holier Than Thou #1*. Her artwork improved much from that day. She eventually left to run the fan club for Lucasfilms. Matthew remembers Maureen as a sweet and good-

natured person. She would describe a circle, and within the circle create some wonderful alien planet landscape. They were all different and all wonderful. She lives in the Bay Area and is missed. **Patron Saint Maureen Garrett** was given Three Cheers and a paint brush.

Reviews: Lynn Maners is reading Mongoliad by numerous authors. About a time when everyone was terrified of the Mongol hordes, and a group bands together to get the Khan. "Khaaaaaan!" Think 50 Shades of Mongolians...

Michelle reviewed Gallifrey One. Incredibly large, friendly convention. 371 ribbons was her final count.

Miscellaneous:

CLJII misced about how last week he had injured his hand. He had been at the doctor. Was told, "Your hand is OK, but you're tachycardic". Off to the ER, as soon as the bus gets him there, at his convenience. Hooked up to machines before paperwork filled out. Shunt in arm caused incredible pain. 




