Called to order: The meeting was called to order at 11:06 am. The Chairman welcomed us to the Sunday, April 9, 2017 meeting of the Board of Directors.

Minutes: The minutes of the meeting of March 12, 2017, were accepted as amended (with one grump). The minutes of the Special Meeting were accepted.

New Members: There were no applications for membership.

Treasurer: (Elayne Pelz): See the Treasurer to get the details of our finances.

30-second Reports:

Chairman (Karl Lembke): Checked our area for cubic feet and it amounts to about the space of a 4-bedroom house. Also, we have decided that we would prefer money for the items we are letting WhedonCon use rather than storage space for these items after the con.

Vice Chairman (Christian McGuire): Made arrangements for a temporary meeting place Art Directors Guild in Studio City for \$150 per meeting. We discussed some pros and cons of this venue. It was moved that we institute a ban on food on our temporary meeting place until a subsequent board meeting may want to change this ban. Seconded and passed with 3 abstentions.

Secretary (Marty Cantor): No report.

Publications (Marty Cantor): APA-L is not a LASFS publication; however, LASFS has always been the APA's home and has always provided space for the APA and the APA has always reciprocated by providing free copies of its disties to the Society. The APA has made arrangements for continued publication if there is an interregnum 'twixt clubhouses and will continue to provide free disties to LASFS wherever it temporarily meets and will rejoin the club in its new permanent quarters. All of the APAs equipment (including the computer and printer used by the club) will be stored in the Secretary's storage unit in his apartment building during any interregnum and will be brought to the new club quarters when there is space for them. // Even though DE PROFUNDIS is not an official organ of the club, I promise to continue producing it as regularly as is possible.

With a vote of 7 Ayes, 2 Nays, and 1 Abstention, it was moved, seconded, and passed to make an offer on the prop-





