About 6500 babies he looked after survived. Lucille spent about 5 months there and was able to later return at age 19 to thank Dr. Couney in person. Now Lucille is buried next to her twin sister.




The next BoD meeting will be on July 9, 2017.





BOARD GAMING MEETUP



The board gaming Meetup which had been meeting at LASFS on Friday Nights has moved to a temporary venue, a game store in Sherman Oaks.
