We find out what Zeppo Marx did after leaving the Marx brothers. He was an agent for an actress, who was at the event at age 100. Other cool stuff was screened.

Highlight, commercial for Edison Kinetophone, the first movie sound system.

It was a cool festival that included a couple of fannish things, a couple of horror, a couple of fantasy, and some really rare animation. It will take place next year.

Participating authors include SFWA's newest Grand Master, William Gibson, as well as Grand Masters Joe Haldeman, Larry Niven, and Connie Willis.





BOARD GAMING MEETUP


