Christian said that Terry Pratchett's *Good Omens* was brilliant and funny, and made him laugh out loud. He suggested reading it first, before the miniseries with David Tennant airs.

Ben Levin saw the latest *Twilight Zone* reboot, and thought that Jordan Peele did a great job as narrator and presenter. Both of the first two episodes played a bit safe, with twists that were more predictable than he might have liked. For example, the first episode, *The Comedian*, was no joke. He figured that caution was to get it off the ground. Social commentary was toned down from the original, but maybe it will get more daring later.

Nick Smith said that Peele's new movie *Us* was well done, but he couldn't say more because of possible spoilers, not even to say what genres it fits into. "It's worth seeing if you are in this room," he remarked cryptically.

Charles Lee Jackson, the Second had seen a document, *It's Me, Sugar*, about the difficulties in getting Marilyn Monroe to perform a satisfactory reading of a single line in *Some Like It Hot*. A chuckle right at the end suggested that the picture's final line had not even been decided upon while shooting was going on.

Francis Hamit reviewed a video he had seen, of the Dalai Lama attending a technical conference. The D.L. is usually unflappable, but he had been greatly moved seeing girl using robot hands, and another girl using telepresence.

Eli reviewed two movies. The first of these, "The Kid," was not the Charlie Chaplin pic, but a story of a fictional character inserted into Billy the Kid's life. He couldn't quite describe the plot, but called it an unusual semi-tragic western with sort of a positive ending. He enjoyed "Captain Marvel," despite some awkward pacing. It had a "magical effect" like other MCU films.

Joyce Sperling had watched a disc of *Mary Poppins Returns*. She found the bonus features also good, and thought it was worth it just to see Dick Van Dyke. Hare Hobbs bought it last week, and thought it was a little flat.


Christian found Wondercon "quite pleasant," and recommends it for comic fans.
