EDITORIAL

I am still looking for a replacement editor for DE PROFUNDIS.

And the above sentence is how, for some time now, I started my notification that I wanted somebody to take over the running of *DE PROFUNDIS*. I interviewed a couple of people; but, as it turned out, I kept the zine.

But now, for a few reasons, I am returning *DE PROFUNDIS* to the LASFS Board of Directors from whom I acquired it several years ago.

Around the turn of this century I took over as editor of *De Prof* and put out the issues each month for about five and a half years. During the whole of that time, all of the issues, usually between 250 to 350 copies of each, were all on paper. I typed all of the stencils at home and printed the copies on Friday afternoons on the LASFS Gestetner CopyPrinter. Fuzzy Pink Niven provided all of the mailing labels and Bob Null assisted me in folding, stapling, and applying the labels to the copies. I then applied stamps and took the issues to the Post Office.

Five and a half years, though, all with mimeo production, finally tired me out. After all, even though I was retired at the time, I was both running and contributing zines to the weekly APA-L and the monthly LAS-FAPA - along with a lot of board gaming ; and, much of the time, serving terms on the LASFS Board of Directors.

So, feeling tired, I turned *De Prof* over to Milt Stevens. Sometime during Milt's tenure at the zine, most of the issues started getting distributed on-line through pdf files.

Eventually, Milt got tired of running the newsletter and the Board, for reasons I disremember, decided to discontinue it. As it had been several years since I turned it over to Milt and my "vacation" from turning out the monthly issues had not only gone away but the work in putting out the issues had dropped considerably as the zine was now a pdf production.

I felt that the club needed a newsletter to let the members know what was going on so I asked the Board if it would give DE PROF to me as I had edited it before, was now on-line and I could easily keep up the pdf format. I did tell the Board that not only would I use the same format layout and the content would be essentially the same with all club notices and suchlike being put in whenever I was given same. In effect, *DE PROF* would be edited totally as it still was the official newsletter of LASFS.

I said that the only change I would make would make would be to produce paper copies which I would sell at my cost to those who preferred paper copies as I considered those who preferred paper to pdf (or did not even have an on-line connexion) would not be considered second-class members and would still get their copies traditionally, on paper, the only difference from the past being that I would be charging money for paper copies. However, I would always attempt to sell the paper copies as close to my cost of production as possible.

Well, the Board gave me *DE PROF* and I have been putting it out ever since that time.

However, as the readers know, the newsletter is now not being issued on a monthly basis. Indeed, this particular issue will barely be out by the end of its second month. (I will, though, list all of the programme items which I can get, and through December.

Sorry, people, but I am kinda tired, have some health issues, and my age - 86 - is finally catching up to me.

I am not dropping all of my LASFS and fannish commitments. After all, I have been a LASFS member since 1975, and that is more than half of my life. I have paid back LASFS by doing things for the club (in addition to the money I have given to the club), such as being Registrar and also being Procedural President twice. I have been on the LASFS' Board of Directors for several terms (and have been Board Secretary most of that time) and I created a photo-documentary of the move from the second to the third clubhouses. (I used a real camera, not a phone, for this.)

I will also resign from my position on the Investment Committee.

But for now, I just cannot keep up with all of the things I have committed to do so I am dropping some of them. I will, though, not cut all of my ties to LASFS. Yes, I am giving *De Prof* back to the Board with my fondest hope that they can find somebody else to edit it. I am also not running for re-election to the Board of Directors - and I also hope that somebody either now on the Board or a new person elected to the Board can do a good job as Board Secretary.

For some time I have kept a master list of Patron Saints, listing each week's Patron Saint in APA-L and providing a copy of the list to the current Procedural President so that he or she can announce and remember them on Thursday meetings.

And, most important to me, I will remain the Official Collator of APA-L and the Little Tin God of LASFAPA - and will continue to contribute zines to these two APAs.

I have no intention of cutting all of my ties to LASFS as the club has been a home base for almost all of my social life for over 46 years and most of my friends are LASFS members.

I just need to relax a bit.
