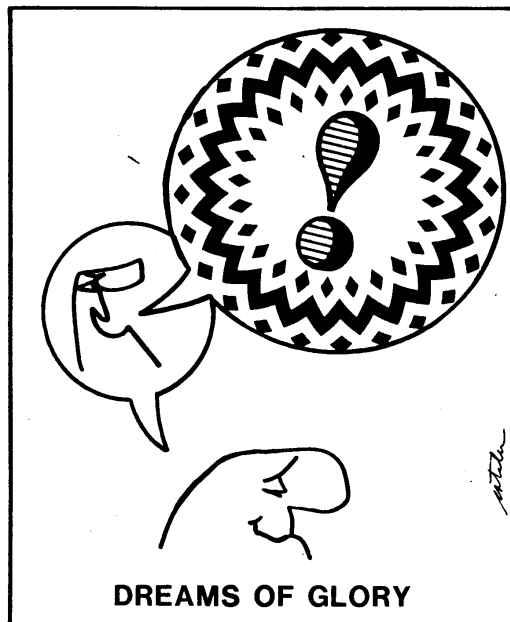

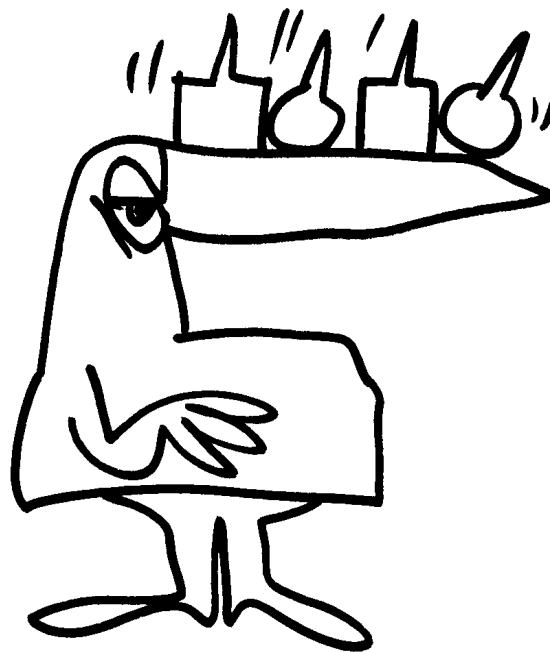

New Members: We have two. Geoffrey Brossmer, who heard about us at the 2002 UCLA Book Fair, and Ken Hughes, a single writer from Van Nuys. Both have the most important qualification, having paid their \$5.00, and were accepted without objection.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report can be gotten from the treasurer.

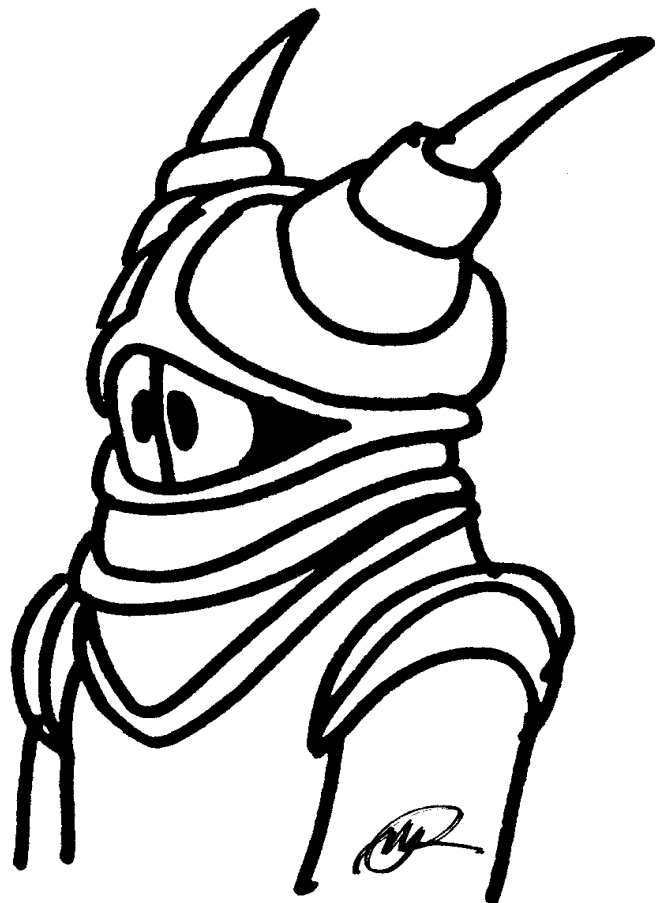
Facilities: We thanked Susan Gleason for her work cleaning up and tending our garden. Ed Green moved that we get No Trespassing signs, to make our right to ask non-members to leave more clear. Cathy seconded this, and after making sure we didn't have to allocate funds specifically for this, it passed.

Furniture: The wooden benches remain in their boxes, as the chains have not been purchased, nor have the holes for the anchors been dug. Although the job isn't difficult, somebody needs to bell the cat. Bob agreed to straw-boss the job on Saturday, July 19, starting at 10 a.m., and a number of people agreed to help. Discussion of details will be deferred to later.

Hall Decoration: Ed asked when the plaques would be done. Cathy replied that she was planning to work on it this week, and it should be done by the next meeting.

Mathom Control: Although this is a procedural office, there is a minor issue which needs the Board's attention. Mr. Null asked that the Board agreed that we no longer need any 16 mm equipment. We have not shown any 16 mm films at a convention for fifteen years, nor at the club for twelve. As we have more equipment than space to store it, we need to dispose of things we no longer need. However, some of it is private property, stored here. The intent is to give the owner a month to sort out who owns what and remove all non-club films; anything not removed will be considered abandoned. Some may go to collectors and there are auction sites specializing in films. After making sure we knew exactly what was intended, the Board agreed, with no objection by any member present. Mr. Thorsen will go through the films and transfer to tape any which need to be kept, and aren't otherwise available.

Marketing We have samples of a possible new design for the LASFS business cards. We thanked the committee for its efforts, after making some minor suggestions. They have also written a new info packet for new members. It will be sent to the Board members for approval and suggestions before publishing. This will be mailed to all new members after being accepted. Michael Mason and Bill Ellern decided



to drop this new responsibility on the Board Secretary. The current Secretary and Procedural Scribe were asked for any input, and both found the suggestion reasonable. Mr. Zeff brought up the issue of postage, Liz assured us that the costs would easily be accommodated by the current line item for Postage. A deadline of one week before the next Board Meeting was set.

Library: We have obtained the needed supplies, and put covers on over 50 books. The Standards and Practices Committee met on schedule, with all members except Cathy present. Mr. Ellern gave the other members copies of this suggested report to the other members in electronic form, and is awaiting their return, with additions, corrections, and suggestions.

Archives: Marty Cantor is sending spare copies of Shaggy to Robert Lichtman in return for copies that fill holes in our collection. He's also looking for other people who can assist by trading. We gave him the authority to make needed trades without Board approval on a case by case basis.

Craft Fair: Thanks were given to Susan Gleason and all others who contributed to making it a success.

LOSCON 31: No report.

Neighborhood Council: The council has created a number of committees open to both council members and the public. Marty has joined the committee on Rules and Elections.

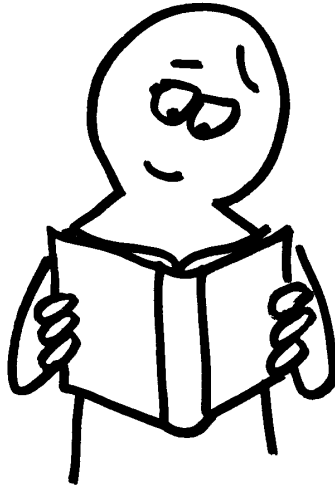

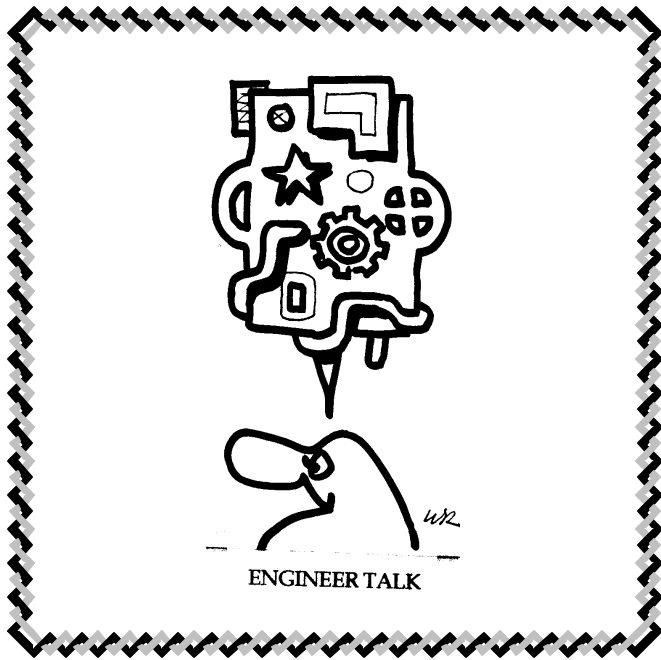
