Called to Order: 11:07 AM

Minutes: The minutes were approved as submitted

New Members: Judy Zeff

Treasurer: No budget report because Treasurer is out of the country attending some to-do in Japan.

Maintenance: Roof repair, repair of West wall and parking bumpers still need to be attended to. The question of crash bars was discussed again. Motion was made and seconded to take \$30,000 from the Century Fund to make infrastructure repairs. A motion passed to table until the decision until the Treasurer was present.

Letter was sent to the neighbor regarding maintenance we intend to do addressing the drainage situation. Neighbor has not only NOT removed his plants, he has installed a permanent watering system.

Ed Green is investigating prices on asphalt repair.

Bob Null notes that power is being wasted due to the thermostat being in the heat flow from the soda machine and also the air conditioning being fiddled with. He proposes installing an accurate thermostat and a padlocked cage to prevent tampering.
Electronic Equipment:

There are no problems with AV systems at this time. Gaming computers are working. One machine is now suitable for playing DVD's only - will hang when game playing is attempted. Inexpensive keyboards have been purchased and installed

Communications: Pubs computer is running fine. Gestetner start button is cracking because of unauthorized users not operating the machine properly. Motion passed for Marty Cantor to get a lock for the power cord to prevent unauthorized use, to come up with a list of authorized users, and to document the process by which users become authorized.

Library: Preparing for the WeHo book fair. Intending to have adult reading list ready for distribution.

Miscellaneous: The club thanked Tony Benoun for providing LASFS business cards.

Marketing Committee Report: Official instructions for West Hollywood Book Fair setup and parking were distributed. We will have a video presentation, author book signings, and a panel. The new bookmarks were presented amidst "oohs" and "ahs". Marketing requested help for setup and tear-down. Book Fair administrations have already requested that we return next year and possibly help them with programming.

Archive: Bob Null has located back issues of Shaggy, neatly organized and labeled. Currently working on preserving early '30s and '40s minutes. Volume of items to be preserved may exceed available space. It may be possible to reclaim some drawer space by sorting and discarding old items. Things do tend to go missing. Various gavels have disappeared. The Library has off-site storage which might be used for archive storage.

Institutional Memory Committee: Updated by-laws (most recent version found so far dates from 2000), list of important documents and where they are, what events are important and when we need to do them so we can set up a calendar, possibly to be web-hosted.

New Agenda: Call to order, minutes, Directors and Others give a 30 second project report (if it needs more time, it should be an agenda item), prepare agenda in advance and let the membership know in case they want to show up for a given matter, new business, new budget items, policies and procedures, long term planning, open forum (like city council open mic: Board sits and listens to members who speak for a brief time. If additional discussion is required the item can be added to the agenda for next meeting). A suggestion was made that the discussion of the new agenda and meeting format be held during the Special Meeting scheduled for September 17th if there is time. A motion was passed to discuss the changes at the next Board meeting. The Chair will announce to the membership that changes are being considered and members will have an opportunity to comment on them.

Motion passed to reactivate the By-Laws Committee with Bill Ellern as the head with authority for additional members of the committee.

Loscon 34: The next meeting is today, mainly concerned with scheduling and programming issues. A message from the Loscon 34 Chair was read. Progress Report #3 is on schedule. Guest invites have gone out. Dealers, advertising, and art show spaces are all being sold. There will be parties and fan tables at Coppercon and Conjecture. Archeology Day is still scheduled for October 27th. There may also be one October 20th at a museum in the San Gabriel Valley.

Yard Sale: A plan has been submitted and work is moving forward. A motion passed to thank Gavin for his good work and then get out of his way so he can do it.

Book Fair is in Arlene's hands.
