Meeting 3958, June 20, 2013
President Matthew B. Tepper, presiding
Karl Lembke, Scribe

Truncheonman Matthew Tepper called meeting #3958 to order at a dozen minutes after 8.

Matthew Tepper reported on the loss of one of our own, Patrick Fahey, who had been regularly in attendance. He passed from complications due to a systemic stroke. In his memory, we had a minute of silence.

We lost a writer, Parke Godwin

The **Menace** from the previous meeting were read and accepted as "In Memory of Patrick Fahey", and Tom Safer paid the sum of \$3.50 to so name them.

Registrar Michelle introduced two guests. Wes Robbins who heard about us from a tire store, And we have Cornelius Robbins, who heard about us from some guy in a tire shop in Hollywood.

Patron Saint Ted Johnstone: He was a member for many years, and sadly died in November of 1977. Of him, Eric Hoffman: He was one of the first he met in fandom, and made him feel like this was an old friend he hadn't seen in a long time. He had an interesting sense of humor, and he enjoyed the man's writing. Milt Stevens: He and a couple of buddies heard about LASFS but weren't sure they wanted to get involved, so they all joined under assumed names. His real name was David McDaniel and he joined LASFS under the name Ted Johnstone. He wrote his professional fiction under his real name and lived under a pseudonym. Since fans were writing the Man from Uncle books, the strangest things would show up in the books.

Tom Locke: Milt had been the first to publish the acronymic for Thrush, this actually got incorporated into one of the TV episodes. Dean Dickensheet invented that acronymic. Kay Shapero came across UNCLE when she was a trek fan. She read *The Vampire Affair*, and was pleased to be introduced to Forry Ackerman and find out he's real. Bill Ellern recalled that Ted, Bjo, Langley (Steve Tolliver) and he often went to lunch or dinner during the week. They would get out of school and come sailing over to South LA, we'd go out to lunch and they'd come back to Zeke Lepine's house and they'd work on producing fanzines. It was a golden age of LASFS fanzines. (Well, silver. Forry ran the golden age.) They produced as many as 100 fanzines. Among these was the first fanzine for Tolkien, definitely a rarity these days. Joe Zeff: although he has not read it himself, he hears David wrote a Prisoner episode, beginning with the line "Drake Woke Up".

Jerry Pournelle first met him at a Worldcon when David McDaniel was a hobbit. Then he met Ted Johnstone, who contributed a story for a collection titled 20/20. It was not a mistake to get a story from him, but it was a mistake to have paid him before getting the story. Dave was as good a storyteller as any of them, and probably a fine example of why writers should avoid marijuana. President Tepper told the hospital story. They were close friends at the time, and Dave was one of Matthew's mentors. Dave liked to ride motorcycles. He took a spill one day. The bike was trashed and he wound up at UCLA medical center with multiple compound fractures in his leg. Matthew, Lee, and Barry Gold visited him. There he was bandaged, in traction, etc. Lee asked, "how are you feeling?" Dave replied, "Oh, I can't kick."

CLJII: The journey Dave was making at the time of the accident was from Mar Vista to Tujunga. They were going to invade the JPL offices and shoot film, along with Dan Alderson. He excelled at cinematography. He was joyfully expert at cutting film. He was not only one of Charlie's first friends, but he wrote the two Man from UNCLE novels he enjoyed. When he moved away to Pennsylvania, CLJII started getting phone calls at 10 PM. He came back in hopes of doing business as a writer, since some club members claimed to have connections but it didn't really pan out. Dave's passing was quite unexpected. Since Charlie found the body, he wound up enduring the attention of the police for a couple of weeks. This also ended their collaboration on a Star Trek novel.

And we gave **Patron Saint Ted Johnstone** Three Cheers and a B Roll Negative.

Eric Hoffman spoke about Patrick Fahey. He came in wearing the hat Patrick gave him. Patrick could be cantankerous, stubborn, grumpy, but he was a rarity. He was a real friend. He was there for Eric when he needed help. He was encouraging, had a sense of humor that ranged from the sly to the bawdy. He was also the man who got closest to giving Eric religion, just from the way Patrick drove. He was a master of offensive driving. He's lost a dear friend.

Z Ernie: A few months ago, when they had the nearing the end conversation, Z promised to come here and say goodbye on Patrick's behalf. When he met Patrick 37 years ago, he was already a member. The best way for me to describe Patrick -- of all the souls I've known in all my travels, he was the most human. Thank you all for the joy and pleasure you have given Patrick over all these years.

Eric again: I wrote a piece on Facebook announcing Patrick's passing -- the litany from the WolfMan: The way you walked was thorny, through no fault of your own...

But as the rain enters the soil, as the river flows into the sea, So must all things come to their predestined end Your suffering is at end....

Reviews: Scratch: Now You See Me, and After Earth, and two others. He found them all enjoyable, even he only remembers two titles. Book, 1901, alternate history, in which Kaiser Germany invades US. It's a good read. It's a three-day read for Scratch.

Father running birthday bash bought tickets for everything they wanted to see, plus popcorn, drink, hot dogs, and stuff. Scratch asked what was budget for weekend? \$7000.

Karl: **Science Report** -- Scientists have discovered the true color of an extrasolar planet. HD 189733b, by spectrometry. Taking the spectrum of light from the star when the planet is visible from Earth, and subtracting the spectrum when the planet is known to be behind the star, the difference is the contribution from the planet itself. It's a deep azure blue. On Earth, this color is due to the planet's oceans and scattering due to oxygen and nitrogen in the air. Because of the temperature, about 1000°C, the blue color of HD 189733b is due to the presence of "raindrops" of molten glass which scatter blue light.

Moral of the story: Just because a planet's blue, you may not want to land on it.

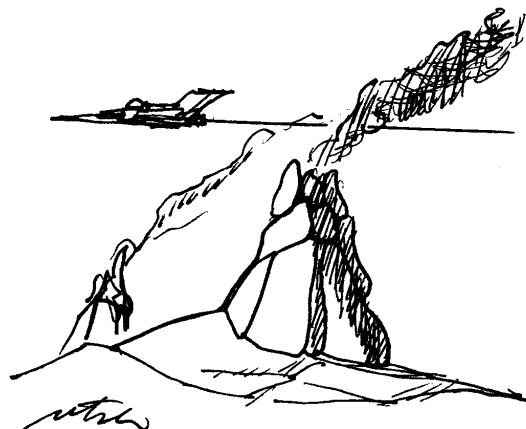
