An announcement from The Board of Directors of the Los Angeles Science Fantasy Society, Inc.

On February 9, 2014, the BOD passed the following resolution:

There will be a temporary ban on all food being brought into the entire property of the LASFS, starting March 1. Already scheduled special events - LA 4000 and Pan Formal - are exempted from this ban.
