From the Hagiography: One of the LASFS librarians and is married to Mike Frank, brother of Sam Frank.

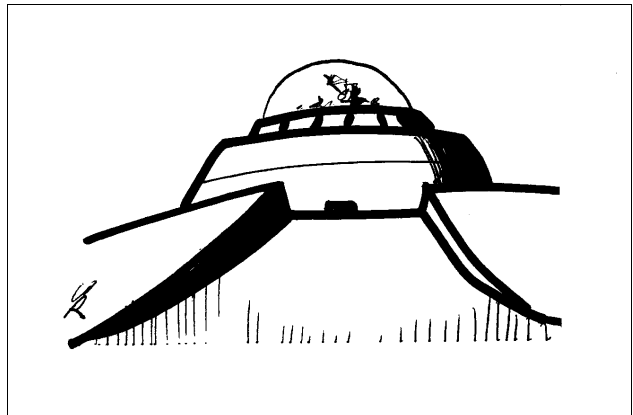
Patron Saint Sue Haseltine was given Three Cheers and Clearance.

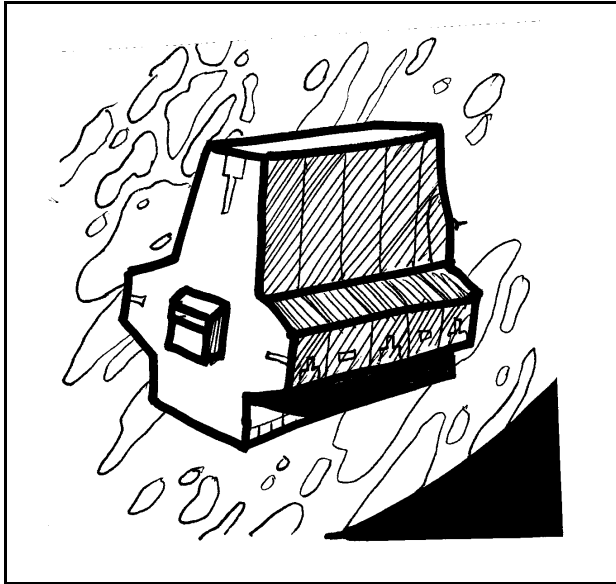

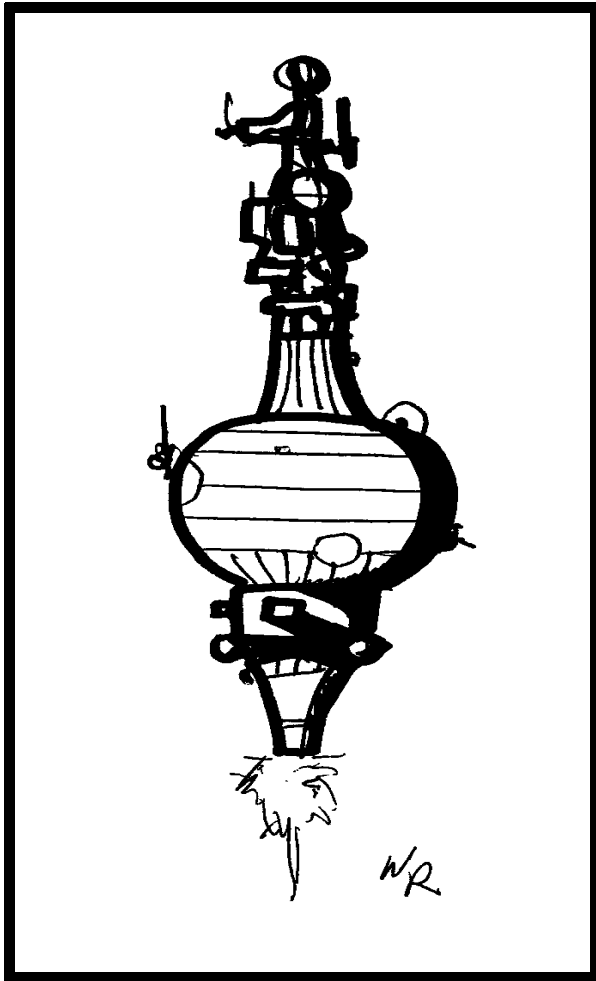
Waller adds they had an electric car race at the Long Beach raceway.
