#### **Moments of Science**

Nick Smith: They're finally getting around to how fruit flies move. There's something funny about the way they run. They built teeny, tiny treadmills and measured with rapid-motion photography how fruit flies run. A fruit fly can run on a split treadmill with each side running at a different speed. They move their legs at different speeds to keep their bodies level. They're very fast for an insect and marathon durable. They can run on a treadmill for an hour at a time. Scientists are still studying their middle legs. It'll assist AI motion of legs.
