Moment of Science

Lynn: Remember the excitement over finding fossil human footprints, dated at @23,000 BP, at White Sands, New Mexico? That date is now under serious review. Critics have noted that prehistoric water levels were fluctuating, so that the ditch grass seeds used to derive that date could have floated up from a lower level. Stay tuned for more "unsettled" science.

Lee: No reason to stay away from social media, because they are paralyzed. New version of mental interfaces, called IBrain, still requires probes to be inserted into the brain. Could be the basis for further developments.

Nick Cal Tech may have created a Quantum digital wormhole, Physicist Maria Spurafalo, co-authored an article in Nature magazine, used quantum computing to create a baby wormhole. Team created a digital simulation in a quantum computing system of two digital Black Holes and showed how data traveled in ways that should only work in a wormhole. Confirms how a wormhole could be created. It also fills the gap between Einstein and Quantum physics, as Einstein predicted decades ago, so maybe it can be figured out.
